

MLA 8 Template

1 Author. | *Author = last name, first name for first author; Multiple Authors: Invert 1st one, not others; 3+ authors = list first author + et. al. (Eg. Smith, John et. al.)*

2 Title of source. | “ ” article/chapter/webpage title; *ITALICIZE if book with one author...i.e. if it is NOT an anthology.*

Container 1 | Include the ones that apply, and skip the ones that don't apply.

3 Title of Container, | *ITALICIZE book, periodical, website title*

4 Other contributors, | *Identify type of contributor: edited by, illustrated by, translated by, etc.; Add name but don't invert*

5 Version, | *Edition of a book □ Eg. 3rd edition; Version of a source □ E.g. King James version*

6 Number, | *Use if source part of a # sequence; Examples: vol. #, issue # (vol. 6, no. 2) of a journal; Season, episode; Vol. of encyclopedia*

7 Publisher, | *Who distributes the source (company name); If publisher of website same as website name, don't include publisher on WCP entry. Examples: Gale, Putnam and Sons, Houghton-Mifflin*

8 Publication date, | *Books = year; Articles/journals/periodicals = full date (day month year)*

9 Location. | *Pg. #s (anthology, PDF database article, print periodical) or URL (website); does not refer to a city*

Container 2 | Often used for digital/electronic sources, such as online database, movie/shows from Netflix, etc. **Choose the ones that apply; skip the ones that don't**

3 Title of Container, | *Database name (Italicize) E.g. ProQuest Research Library or SIRS Issues Researcher*

7 Publisher,

8 Publication date, | *Date Accessed (E.g. Access 13 Apr. 2020); **Most citation generators don't include this, so you will need to add it if you're using one.***

9 Location. | *Location in database [DOI #, source ID, or URL]*
